

Cape Town Golf Holiday

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DAY 1: ARRIVAL DAY: CAPE TOWN



Arrival Cape Town International Airport

On arrival at Cape Town International Airport you will be welcomed by a Winners Staff member, who will assist you to your transfer.

Once luggage has been loaded, you will depart on a City sightseeing tour, followed by excursion to Table Mountain



Table Mountain is one of the official New 7 Wonders of Nature, following a lengthy international public voting process. You can get to the top of Cape Town's most famous icon in just five minutes by taking a cable car up, or spend the better part of your day hiking it. Table Mountain Cableway, established in 1929, takes visitors to the top in one of two cable cars, each with rotating floors and huge windows to ensure your views while travelling are almost as spectacular as those on the summit. Cable cars depart every 10 to 15 minutes. From the top of Table Mountain, there are magnificent views of the Cape Town city centre, surrounding suburbs and the Atlantic Ocean. Landmarks in view include Cape Town Stadium, Robben Island and Camps Bay beach.

After your group descends from the mountain they will be transferred to The Portswood Hotel where accommodation has been reserved for 7 nights on Bed and Breakfast basis



THE PORTSWOOD HOTEL:

Located on the V&A Waterfront, this chic hotel offers free Wi-Fi and an outdoor swimming pool with terrace. Guests can benefit from 24-hour room service. Guest rooms of The Portswood are decorated in a maritime style and offer air conditioning and satellite TV. Each room

has an en-suite bathroom with a bathtub and shower. A rich breakfast is served daily. The poolside terrace offers a charming setting for a light snack or drink. Guests can also visit the Quarterdeck Restaurant with its Indian cuisine and Cape Malay decorations. The cocktail bar is available for drinks. The Portswood Hotel is situated 3 km from the city centre and 25 km from Cape Town International Airport.

DAY 2: CAPE TOWN

Breakfast to be enjoyed at the Hotel

09h00: **Depart from the hotel and travel with your English Speaking Guide from the hotel via Sea Point, Camps Bay onto Hout Bay .**

Enjoy a stop at Hout Bay Harbour with the option of a boat trip to Seal Island. Proceed to Cape Point Nature Reserve via Chapman's Peak Drive.

The 9km Chapman's Peak Drive

winds its way between Noordhoek and Hout Bay on the Atlantic Coast on the south-western tip of South Africa. Chapman's Peak Drive is one of the most spectacular marine drives in the world.

Affectionately known as "Chappies" and is a must for anyone who is

passionate about the majestic Cape Town scenery, with sheer drops to the sea below and towering mountains rising above you. The twists and curves in the road seem endless and it is a photographers dream. It is a paradise for motorists, sightseers, picnickers, runners, hikers and bikers (both the motorised and the manual varieties).



Cape Point Nature Reserve

At Cape Point the warm Mozambique current meets the cold Benguela current, making a significant impact on all forms of marine life in the vicinity and on the flora of the peninsula.

The reserve was started in 1936 to preserve the indigenous flora and fauna of the Cape Peninsula. Though exposed, often windswept, and less verdant than the rest of the Peninsula, the 7750ha reserve has as many plant varieties as there are in the whole of Britain. In addition



to the predominating Protea and heath varieties there are numerous endangered species and a few that are found nowhere else. The fauna includes eland, bontebok, rhebok, grysbok, springbok, baboon, porcupine, ostrich and zebra.



The principal road through the reserve ends near the summit of Cape Point from where you have the choice to walk or to take a funicular up the steep slope to the highest point. From this position the panorama is breathtaking, encompassing the whole of False Bay and the Hottentots Holland Mountains beyond.

By far the most dramatic view, however, is downward, for the vantage point is 209m above the rocks at which point the warm Mozambique current meets the cold Benguela current.

From here guests will travel towards Simonstown, stopping at a very special scenic spot; the Seaforth.

13h30 Lunch at the Seaforth Restaurant

Seaforth Restaurant

Set on the white sands of Seaforth Beach in Simon's Town, with stunning views of mountains and sea, and penguins to entertain you, Seaforth Restaurant is a spectacular venue on the water's edge. Seaforth offers you the opportunity to delight in the fruits of the sea, or a range of platters fit for the most discerning palate.



15h00: Depart from Seaforth and travel to Boulders Beach to view the penguin colony.

16h30: After a visit to the Penguins, travel back to Hotel where tour will disembark between 17h30 and 18h00.


RONDERBOSCH GOLF COURSE:

Rondebosch Golf Club's 18-hole course is rated as a "must-play" amongst golfers. Situated only ten minutes from Cape Town's city centre, with magnificent views of Devils Peak and Table Mountain, the course is a popular choice for local and foreign visitors.

Since its establishment in 1911, the Club has built a solid tradition, which is upheld by its strong membership. Continued development and beautification has ensured that the course maintains its excellent condition all year round. It remains a challenge to the serious golfer, but is user friendly for the less experienced.

Rondebosch has hosted seven consecutive Sunshine Tour events, 2 professional ladies European Tour events and the South African Ladies Amateur Open.

DAY 4: CAPE TOWN – MOWBRAY GOLF COURSE

MOWBRAY GOLF COURSE:

Founded in 1910, the club is recognized as being one of the best in the country with all major amateur championships having been played there. Mowbray has hosted the SA Open seven times and the Bells Cup three times.

Set at the foot of Table Mountain, Mowbray Golf Club is renowned for its breathtaking views, lush fairways and immaculate greens. There is a variety and abundance of birdlife clusters around the water features. Experience the pleasure of teeing off down newly mown fairways, bordered by tall pines and indigenous trees.

SIGNATURE HOLE

With the imposing Devils Peak as your aiming point off the tee, the 15th is a tough par-4 with a narrow fairway lined by pine trees.

DAY 5: CAPE TOWN

You have the day to relax and enjoy an optional site seeing activity, Robben Island tour

ROBBEN ISLAND:

The Robben Island's tour includes a visit to the lime quarry, which was used by the prisoners to mine lime. The harsh white light and heat in the quarry in summer and the long, wet winters made it an extremely uncomfortable space to work in.

A visit to the maximum-security prison, home to Nelson Mandela for many years, is one of the important highlights of the tour on Robben Island. This section includes the single cells in which Nelson Mandela and other prisoners spent their prison time in. In the village tour you get to see the leper cemetery, Sobukhwe House, WW II gun batteries as well as the houses used by the ward.



Return by ferry from Robben Island and transfer back to your hotel.

DAY 6: CAPE TOWN – ROYAL CAPE GOLF COURSE

ROYAL CAPE GOLF COURSE:

Founded in 1885, the Royal Cape Golf Club is South Africa's oldest and most exclusive club featuring a course with narrow fairways lined by trees. The Royal Cape Golf Club is in the southern suburbs of Cape Town, a 15 minute drive from the city centre and from Cape Town International Airport.

A true championship course, having hosted the South African Open eleven times and the South African Amateur Championships eight times, it has recently undertaken a reconstruction programme of all eighteen greens strictly to the specifications of the United States Golf Association.

THE COURSE

The course today is a fine test of golf especially when the south-easter is blowing. Essentially it is a flat parkland course, well maintained and a pleasure to play with lovely views of the Table Mountain range. The fairways are narrow and tree-lined.

Wayward shots are penalised by trees and the greens are well bunkered. There is also plenty of water on the course, particularly at the corner of the 3rd and 4th and 5th holes and also at the 14th, 15th and 16th holes. The most difficult holes are the par 4 third, at 435m the longest two-shotter on the course, and the par 4 14th played into the teeth of the prevailing



south-easter with water guarding the right of the green. The greens are well bunkered and there is plenty of water on the course.

DAY 7: CAPE TOWN - ERINVALLE GOLF COURSE

ERINVALLE GOLF COURSE:

The Gary Player-designed 18-hole golf course has fast become renowned throughout the golfing fraternity both locally and abroad. The impressive club house provides all the appropriate amenities for golfers, including an outstanding Pro Shop.

Erinvale hosted the 1996 World Cup of Golf, where thirty-two participating nations competed. The international golfers found the course both a golfing challenge and visual delight. Erinvale also hosted the 2005 SAA Open, showcasing South African golfing talent.

SIGNATURE HOLE

Your biggest test of nerve comes on the par-four 17th hole, a great finishing hole that swoops downhill. You play from an elevated tee, with tall pines flanking one side of the fairway, and an out-of-bounds fence the other side.
